Description: This agreement will allow the use of State-owned aquatic lands for the sole purpose of a salmon redd scour study. It is located in the Cedar River, in King County, Washington.

Seattle Public Utilities proposes to perform a scour study relating to sockeye salmon redds in the Cedar River below Landsburg Dam. SPU proposes to install accelerometers as well as estimate the minimum depth of the egg pocket within a number of salmon redds during the upcoming spawning season.


Seattle Public Utilities proposes to perform the study within the Cedar River between the Landsburg Dam and a point approximately four miles south of Lake Washington.
