Science Session:

*Type F TWIG - Best Available Science Presentation – Approval

Dave Schuett-Hames gave a presentation on the report and answered questions. Howard Haemmerle discussed the next steps for approval of the document. SAGE

★ *Eastern Washington Forest Hydrology Study – final approval

Hans Berge reported that the study has come back from ISPR and all comments have been incorporated by the author. The revised report went out for concurrent review to SAGE and CMER. Comments were received from Todd Baldwin and Doug Martin and the report is now ready for final CMER approval. Baldwin proposed that the report be approved as final. Martin seconded. – **Approved**

Next steps – Howard Haemmerle and Greg Stewart will work with Dan Miller and SAGE to write the six questions that will go along with the report to Policy for their approval.

♦ ***EWRAP** – *final approval*

Baldwin reported that the document had gone through the SAGE review and that CMER members of SAGE had been reviewers. He asked if there were any other CMER members who wanted to review and comment on the document or if it should be approved. There were questions about having enough CMER reviewers. Doug Martin, Chris Mendoza, Mark Hicks, and Todd Baldwin reviewed the document. No one else was interested in reviewing it.
