<a href="#">SB 5391</a>	Exempts dual-sport motorcycles from needing the Discover Pass. <a href="#">SB 5289</a>	Exempts vehicles driving on agency managed roads, not blocked by a gate, from needing a Discover Pass. Persons purchasing a license, permit or decal from WDFW may also purchase a Discover Pass for \$20 during the same transaction.	substitute bill (NRP 13)do pass, made eligible to be placed on second reading 2/25. <a href="#">HB 1632</a>	<p>Creates a new category of registered vehicles, "all-terrain wheeled vehicles" and requires metal tags. Creates an on-road tab for all-terrain wheeled vehicles for use on select public roadways in the state. Exempts all-terrain wheeled vehicles with on-road tabs from the definition of "motor vehicle", thus exempting them from needing a Discover Pass. All-terrain wheeled vehicles being used to render emergency care in an incident involving off-road vehicles do not need ORV registration and decals. Creates a multi-use roadway account for moneys from on-road tabs. Violations of land management requirement by operators of all-terrain wheeled vehicles may receive an infraction up to \$500. The infraction does not have to be in the presence of a law enforcement officer if sufficient evidence is provided and a follow up investigation. ORV registration requirements will not apply to all-terrain wheeled vehicles. Raises the minimum age for operators of ORV from 13 to 16 for crossing roads unless they are supervised by a person at least 18. All-terrain wheeled vehicles will not need motor vehicle liability insurance.</p>	<p>2/11 public hearing in the House Committee on Transportation. <a href="#">SB 5657</a>	<p>Eliminates the State Parks Discover Pass exemption for the following groups: the Disabled as defined by Social Security Administration, Senior Citizens who qualify for property tax exemptions, Disabled Veterans, and Foster Parents. Retains camping discounts for those groups plus for persons eligible for food stamps. Provides free Discover Passes for all persons eligible for a camping discount. Married couples may combine volunteer hours for a complimentary Discover Pass. Establishes a State Parks license plate; vehicles with this license plate will not need a Discover Pass at State Parks. General fund reimbursements State Parks for camping discounts. General fund reimbursements for all free Discover Passes. General Fund match for all Discover Pass sales. <a href="#">SB 5575</a>	<p>Moneys that previously were deposited into the "waste reduction, recycling, and litter control account" shall instead be deposited in the "State Parks renewal and stewardship account".
