Structural Building Blocks:

Five mandates (provided by state legislature - 2SSB 5367)

- Protect and enhance the water supply and protect the watershed;
- Maintain working lands for forestry and grazing while protecting key watershed functions and aquatic habitat;
- Maintain and where possible expand recreational opportunities consistent with watershed protection, for activities such as hiking, fishing, hunting, camping, birding and snowmobiling;
- Conserve and restore vital habitat for fish, including steelhead, spring chinook, and bull trout, and wildlife, including deer, elk, large predators, and spotted owls; and
- > Support a strong community partnership in which the Yakama Nation, residents, business owners, local governments, conservation groups and others provide advice about ongoing land management.

The Advisory Committee will work together to:
